Approximately 50 floral designs by professional florists, talented hobbyists, and members of The Stuart Society will fill the Museum. Thursday, April 7: Art in Bloom 2016 opens to the public from 1-8 p.m. Museum admission is only \$5 after 5 p.m. on Thursday.

Be one of the first to view the inventive floral designs and enjoy sumptuous hors d'oeuvres; cocktails, including a signature drink; wine; and jazz in the Marly Room and Membership Garden. Images of works from the collection, along with recipes from *Food + Art* and unique floral designs, will decorate each serving station.

Alexandre Renoir, the great-grandson of the legendary French artist Pierre-Auguste Renoir, will be the guest of honor. His famous family also includes film director Jean Renoir, actor Pierre Renoir, director of photography Claude Renoir Jr., and his daughter actress Sophie Renoir, to name a few.

Born in 1974 in the south of France, Mr. Renoir moved with his family to Canada at the age of four. He revealed his talent early, graduating from the Victoria School of the Arts and taking classes at the Royal Alberta Museum, both in Edmonton. He studied a variety of media, even ceramics and woodworking, and started designing jewelry for a family venture. He later turned to charcoal drawing and painting, demonstrating the influence of French Impressionism. His work is now in private collections around the world. Mr. Renoir will make comments and greet patrons during "Flowers After Hours."

Friday, April 8: *Art in Bloom* continues at the MFA from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. The flowers will be refreshed each day.

Local floral designers will welcome patrons to the luncheon with demonstrations inspired by the Museum's popular painting *Jule Lebrun as Flora* (1799) by her mother Elisabeth-Louise Vigée-Lebrun. They will respond to the question: How would you welcome Vigée-Lebrun back to the Museum? This prized work is currently in the artist's first retrospective, *Vigée-Lebrun: Woman Artist in Revolutionary France*, now on view at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.

Kimberly Schlegel Whitman, one of the country's top lifestyle and entertaining experts, will share tips, including on floral design, at the luncheon. A young civic leader and philanthropist, Mrs. Whitman was named Volunteer of the Year by the American Heart Association, one of her many awards. She holds her BA in art history with honors from Southern Methodist University and completed further study in art connoisseurship at Christie's, New York.
